Anthropologists

<u>Goals:</u>

To identify communication cues in an unfamiliar culture, to use systematic information-gathering and analysis techniques, and to explore ambiguities and examine salient factors in cross-cultural interaction from the perspectives of both the host culture and visiting anthropologists.

<u>2 groups:</u> host culture anthropologists

Anthropologists' instructions:

- a) Interview as many persons of the host culture as possible.
- b) Use research methods ask several people the same question(s) and verify responses for consistency; observe behaviour; look for patterns.
- c) After ten minutes you'll be asked to describe the culture.
- d) Anthropologists "interview guideline" have been developed:
 - 1) Are all of you from the same culture?
 - 2) Do all of you speak the same language?
 - 3) Are you friendly to outsiders?
 - 4) Do you practice the same religion?
 - 5) Is the same food prepared by all culture members?
 - 6) Do you live in extended families?
 - 7) Are children educated in public schools?
 - 8) Are most people in cities?
