

Preparation for a change

- New determined leaders in the U.S. and USSR
 - Ronald Reagan
 - Mikhail Gorbachev
- Costly arms race + economic problems in the USSR
- Economic and political reforms in the USSR perestroika and glasnost
- Critique of Communist regime in the USSR + public against Soviet—Afghan War + Chernobyl accident in Ukraine
- 1986 Reykjavík talks fewer ballistic missiles arsenals in Europe, nuclear arms control, failed because of SDI
- 1988 Summer Olympics in Seoul USSR and U.S. both participated from 1976
- **1989 Malta talks** (Bush x Gorbachev)
 Gorbachev: "I assured the President of the United States that I will never start a hot war against the USA."








Time for revolution

- Less tight grip of the USSR on the Soviet Bloc countries
- Impossibility of central control without restorting to military force
- Tacit consent of Gorbachev in collapse of communist government
- 1987 "Tear Down This Wall!" speech of Reagan

"General Secretary Gorbachev, if you seek peace, if you seek prosperity for the Soviet Union, Central and South-East Europe, if you seek liberalization, come here to this gate;
Mr. Gorbachev, open this gate.

Mr. Gorbachev, tear down this wall!"





Time for freedom

- 1989 Polish anticommunist Solidarity gained among public Polish communist Party started discussion with Solidarity elections with anti-communist Parties won by Solidarity spark for more revolutions
- 1990 first democratic president in Eastern bloc in Poland
- 1989 the same in Hungary, in 1990 democratic elections
- 1989 massive calm protests against communist parties in Czechoslovakia and East Germany – velvet revolutions
- violent protests in Bulgaria and Romania
- November 1989 Fall of the Berlin Wall
 end of the Iron Curtain
- October 1990 Germany reunified








Collapse of the Russian Bear

- 1989 open debates in USSR media, first elections with more than one party
- 1990 communist party in USSR announced the end of its monopoly of power
- 1991 Soviet republics independent Lithuania, Estonia, Latvia, Ukraine
- June 1990 Boris Yeltsin as President of Russia
- July 1991 Warsaw Pact ended
- 1991 unsuccessful attempt at coup overthrowing Gorbachev led by Vice-President and staunch communists, Boris Yeltzin against the coup
- September 1991 COMECON ended
- November 1991 end of Communist party of the Soviet Union
- December 1991 USSR officially dissolved Russian Federation began
- **1991 Commonwealth of Independent States** 9 out of 15 former Soviet republics + associate members (Ukraine, Turkmenistan)



Legacy

- Economic transition of post-socialist countries
 (Czech Republic, Hungary, Poland, Slovakia, Baltic states)
 - Denationalization, privatization
 - Fight against hyperinflation
 - Liberalization
 - Neoliberalism
 - Corruption
- Fast integration of some into the EU (EC then), NATO, other "western" structures
- Chaotic transition to free-market + oligarchy system in other countries
- Beyond the EU and NATO borders the countries more or less under military and economic dependency on Russia
- Political transformation of former communist parties into reformist social democratic parties and less reformist communist parties (Czech Republic, Russia, Ukraine)
- Military spending + military sell-outs for needed cash
- U.S. Russian continuing cooperation in space exploration
- Gorbachev: "The end of the Cold War is our common victory."

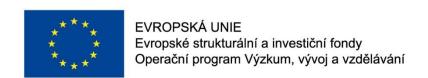
