

## American-Soviet relationship before the crises

- 1953 new political leadership in both countries
  - Dwight D. Eisenhower
  - Nikita Khrushchev
- De-Stalinization in Russia 20th Congress of the Soviet Communist Party move away from Stalin's
  policies
- 1956 Khrushchev: "Whether you like it or not, history is on our side. We will bury you."
- New Look policy in the US greater reliance on nuclear weapons (more air–strike oriented than conventional military) + doctrine of massive retalitation
- 1956 Suez Crisis, Hungarian Revolution, Chinese-Soviet split
- 1960 U-2 Incident deterioration in relationship
- 1957–1961 Repeated USSR nuclear threats to the West
- During the 1950s and early 1960s decolonization space for the Cold War in the Third World, selling armaments to "friendly" countries
- 1961 Antarctic Treaty Antarctica as a scientific preserve for research without any military

#### **Berlin Wall Crisis**


 Brain Drain – people fleeing from East to West Berlin (over 3 mil., 20 % of population by 1961)

- BERUN WALL

- November 1958 Russian attempt to make whole Berlin "free, independent, demilitarized" city
- **Berlin Ultimatum** 6 months to withdraw American, British, and France troops from West Berlin x not accepted x US military build—up
- Khrushchev: "Berlin is the testicles of the West. Every time I want to make the West scream, I squeeze
  on Berlin."
- June 1961 new ultimatum on withdrawing Allied forces from West Berlin x not accepted
- June November 1961 Berlin Wall Crisis (Second Berlin Crisis)
- Ulbricht: "Niemand hat die Absicht, eine Mauer zu errichten!"
   "No one has the intention to erect a wall!"
- August 1961 barbed—wire barrier (the Soviet Army present)
- Building the Berlin Wall
- Kennedy: "It's not a very nice solution, but a wall is a hell of a lot better than a war."











#### **Cuban Revolution**

 January 1959 the July 26 Movement led by Fidel Castro seized power



- Nixon met with Castro, Cuba began purchasing arms from the East
- January 1961 American—Cuban relationship worsened change of regime in Cuba?
- April 1961 Bay of Pigs Invasion unsuccessful ship—born invasion orchestrated by CIA – public humiliation of the US
- Castro publicly announced Cuba as a communist country Soviets promised support







#### **Cuban Missile Crisis**

- October November 1962 Cuban Missile Crisis
- Cuban Project US continued in attemps at overthrowing Cuban government and Castro's assassination + missiles in Turkey and Italy
- Soviet preparations to install nuclear missiles in Cuba
- US naval blockade of Cuba + ultimatum for the USSR
- Khrushchev removed the missiles x US stopped to intervene in Cuba
- First efforts at nuclear disarmament and improving West–East relations






